
Cuyahoga Falls High School DECA: "All-In" and Winning!

Congratulations to Cuyahoga Falls High School's *Interactive Marketing & Design* class and teacher, Mr. Wargowsky for winning the Cleveland Cavaliers "Cavalry Marketing Competition"!

The Cavaliers presented to area high schools the problem of how to better market and promote the *Cavs Cavalry* in an effort to get local teens more involved while supporting the team. After a competition amongst dozens of Ohio high schools, Cuyahoga Falls was determined the winner!

The CFHS DECA students will be presented with a trophy on Saturday, February 11th during the pregame. They will also receive free tickets to the game and most importantly work with the Cavs organization to better the fan experience for our local teenagers.

The program developed by students in Wargowsky's



class was to create a \$150 yearly membership to the *Cavs Cavalry* that would include:

CFCSD: 4.75 Mill RENEWAL Levy On the May Ballot

On January 18, 2017, the Cuyahoga Falls City Schools Board of Education voted unanimously at its regularly scheduled meeting to place a 4.75 mill RENEWAL levy on the May 2, 2017 ballot. This is a five-year RENEWAL that was last on the ballot in March of 2012 and is set to expire in December of 2017. This RENEWAL will NOT increase taxes, and accounts for approximately 6% of the Districts annual operating budget.

Where do our tax dollars go?

Our dollars reach the classrooms for instruction. Over the last three years, the Cuyahoga Falls City School District has ranked in the top 10 of all school districts our size (2500-4999 students) in terms of the percentage of funds spent on classroom instruction. Last year we ranked 2nd out of 109 districts our size in Ohio. The monies generated by this renewal are critical to maintaining the educational opportunities that the District currently provides.

New and Changed Program of Studies Offered

In the on-going effort to be sure that the CFCSD is preparing our students for life after high school, whether it be college or career, the District, with Board approval at the January 25 BOE meeting, has made some changes to the High School Program of Study curriculum.

CFHS Program of Study Changes/Highlights:

Additions:

- New Senior Capstone and Preparing for College courses added
- New English electives added include Intro to Debate and Video Announcements Production
- New Family and Consumer Science Course: Textile Design, Construction and Maintenance
- New Applied Geometry and AP Calculus BC courses added
- *Chemistry* will become the required sophomore science (after the addition of *Biology* as a required science course for Freshmen was implemented last year)
- New additions of Adaptive Culinary Fundamentals and Adaptive Lifetime Fitness
- Foreign Languages are now referred to as World Languages
- New Cross-Cultural Communications class

Changes:

- Dropped CP/College Preparatory out of class titles "It is an antiquated term and it does not fit with our College and Career Readiness (CCR) mentality. Our notion is that we prepare all students for college and careers and provide them with the tools and preparation to make their own choices after high school," says Deputy Superintendent, Melvin Brown.
- After our transition year, Biology and American History will be typical freshmen courses next year.

According to Brown, "The implementation of *Biology* at the Freshman year stems from the elimination of *Physical Science* as a single class from the curriculum. *American History*, previously, was also a Sophomore year course. Moving all of this to the Freshman year gives students more opportunity to diversify their transcript and experience more varied coursework."

Richardson Elementary: Where in the World?

On Friday, January 20, the preliminary round of the annual Richardson *Geography Bee* took place at a school assembly. In all, 21 students from the 4th and 5th grades competed.



After the preliminary round, the field was down to ten students to vie for the Richardson *Geo-Bee* title to be determined in the championship round on January 26. The top-three finishers were 5th grader, Alex Eggleton (3rd), 4th grader, Rayya Priebe (2nd), and when all was said and done, 5th grader Madison Davidson won the Richardson *Geo-Bee* crown!

As the winner, Madison has taken an on-line multiple choice test for Ohio's State Geography Bee. The top 100 scorers will be invited to compete in Columbus, Ohio. Good luck Madison and congratulations!
