- Naviance is a comprehensive 6-12 college and career readiness platform that enables self-discovery, career exploration, academic planning, and college preparation including transcripts and scholarships.
- School districts purchase Naviance to help students explore their interests and strengths and develop a course of study that matches long-term goals with an actionable plan.

FAFSA **FREE Application For Federal Student Aid**

- Apply for parent and student FSA ID numbers at studentaid.gov. (FSA ID is your online signature)
- Submit FAFSA after Oct. 1. Check FAFSA deadlines for each college to which applying. Tax information is needed to complete. Financial Aid, including loans, begins with the FAFSA.
- Within 2-3 weeks, SAR report (Student Aid Report) should arrive online. The college will also receive student SAR info.
- College mails/e-mails initial award letter to student.
- More FAFSA info at Senior Night in Fall.

Scholarships

- Merit scholarships are available upon admission and are based on grades and test scores.
- Complete FAFSA to qualify for loans or grants.
- Check scholarships offered through parent/student employment, civic groups, or church.
- Apply for local and national scholarships through CFHS Naviance site.

Athletic Scholarships

- All athletes applying to Div. 1 and Div. 2 colleges must register through the NCAA or NAIA Eligibility Center.

- Follow instructions for applying to the college from the college coach.
- For NCAA/NAIA transcripts, students should set up their account online and request their transcript via Naviance.

The Common Application

- The Common App consists of more than 900 member colleges with only one application. The Common Application is comprised of a rich and diverse membership – colleges that are public, private, large, small, secular, and religious.
- This is useful to some students but not all. Please check college website for preferred application and/or see you counselor.

If Applying to a Common Application School...

- Students must create an account at www.commonapp.org



- Students must link their Common Application account to their Naviance account in the college tab.



- Complete the college application online



- Login to Naviance to Request Transcripts to be sent
