2019-2020 Year-End Review

What a school year 2019-2020 has been! It is definitely one we will never forget; and it is likely one that changes our lives forever. We started with the energy of a combination levy campaign that resulted in the approval of a \$113 million construction project to create a campus on the Bolich/Newberry property. The building will serve as a home to educate our students in grades 6 through 12. The new building will contain a 1,400-seat performing arts center and the campus will house a 5,000-seat multi-purpose stadium.

Just as 2020 was getting started, we were introduced to a new virus and our world changed. We were issued stay-at-home orders, school buildings were closed, and education was expected to continue. We scrambled to deliver on-line instruction for the three-weeks surrounding spring break. When the three-week order turned into the remainder of the school year, we lost spring sports, the musical, performances, prom, and graduation as we knew it. In the end, CFHS faculty and administration saved the day with a virtual commencement ceremony and parade that were cutting edge and an event to be admired by many.

As we prepare for fall 2020 and the reopening of school, we have many more questions than answers. In response to guidance from Columbus, we assembled two task force teams. The first team to consider and recommend academic decisions and the second team buildings decisions. The two teams will be brought together, and final decisions will be made with a target date of August 1, 2020. To help guide the decisions, we are issuing three surveys (parent, faculty, secondary student). We will need to have the surveys returned by June 12, 2020.

We are committed to updating the community as decisions are being made relative to the school calendar, delivery of education, etc. It is quite likely that the 2020-2021 school year will be as crazy as the last one, but we will work through it together as a united *Black Tiger Family!*

Another one of the CFCSD's finest is getting some well-deserved recognition! CFHS Intervention Specialist Mrs. Shannon Hoover is being recognized by the *State Support Team (SST) Region 8* as a finalist for the *Franklin B. Walter Outstanding Special Educator Award*!

The *SST8* includes educators from Medina, Portage, and Summit Counties.

The Franklin B. Walter Outstanding Educator Award is presented to one educator from each of Ohio's sixteen State Support Team regions, who have made extraordinary contributions

to the education of students with disabilities. According to the *SST8* website, this award is given in honor of the late Franklin B Walter, Superintendent of Public Instruction from 1977 until 1991, a post held longer than any other state superintendent in Ohio's history. With over 50 years of service as a teacher and administrator, Dr. Walter's leadership is evident in many of Ohio's quality educational initiatives and programs. Among these is the development of the nation's first statewide plan for children with disabilities. Nominee(s) for this prestigious award are recognized for outstanding work

in one of three categories:

- High Impact Instruction
- Growing Great Schools
- Systems Leadership

Director Jenine M. Sansosti of the *SST8* said, "We were so impressed by all that we learned of your outstanding approaches for teaching students with moderate to intensive disabilities, as well as your creativity, positive attitude, and work ethic that we are thrilled to honor you as our region's top special educator of the year."

This year, under the current circumstances, the *SST8* will not be able to honor Hoover in person at the local awards ceremony in Summit County or at the state-level event hosted by the *Ohio Coalition for the Education of Children with Disabilities (OCECD)*. However, both *SST8* and *OCECD* intend to honor all nominees and their regional finalists with a certificate of recognition and on their website and social media.

CFHS Principal Miss Allison Bogdan added, "Congratulations, Mrs. Shannon Hoover!!! We will definitely be shouting this from the rooftops. I appreciate everything you do for our students and this community. THANK YOU!"

Bolich: Bolich did a big reverse parade for our 8th-grade students where our students drove through campus, we clapped them through, and gave them all of their awards for the year, along with some other goodies and a class of 2024 t-shirt. "It was a great collaboration between our school, parents, PTO, and the community" said Principal Ryan Huch.
