### 1. Complete 21 course credits

Physical Education	.5 Units
Electives	6 Units
Total Units	21 Units




### 1. Complete 21 course credits

- Social Studies Ohio's minimum course requirements within the three required units
- 2019 and 2020 ½ unit in American history (CFHS students take 1 unit)
- 2019 and 2020 ½ unit in American government
- 2021 an additional ½ unit in world history and civilizations (CFHS students take 1 unit)



# Ohio law created three pathways for students to earn a diploma



#### 2. Three Graduation Pathways



At least 18 points on state tests



Industry-recognized credential **AND** a work-readiness score on WorkKeys



Remediation-free score on ACT or SAT



### Three Graduation Pathways



At least 18 points on state tests







Earn a minimum of four points in English tests

Earn a minimum of four points in math tests

Earn a minimum of **six points** in science and social studies tests

Additional **four points** selected from any of the content areas

#### **Test Schedule:**

December/January April/May

Students take state tests at the end of the course.
